MISION

CEPIA (Culture, Education and Psychology for Infants and Adolescents) is a Costa Rican based non-profit and non-governmental organization, which seeks to improve the quality of life of children and teenagers and their families from poor backgrounds in Guanacaste by promoting cultural development, educational and labor opportunities, physical and mental health, social cohesion and participation. 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WHY?

Unfortunately in 2020, it is estimated that poverty reached 22% of all households, of which 6% live in extreme poverty. Furthermore, boys are receiving many negative and confusing messages in their communities, on social media and music, in schools, at home: anger is the only 'acceptable' way to express difficult emotions, men need to have power and control over women to be seen as a strong man, boys should not cry or show weakness, sexual abuse makes you gay, men are not good caregivers, and so on. Many adult men report having suffered from sexual abuse or violence during childhood, but almost no boys speak about it when it happens or when they are at risk. Men are not taking easily responsibility in pregnancy of women. 40 % of youth don't finish high school education.



The core of the project

During 10 months a male psychologist offers a weekly 2-hour workshop to 20 boys, aged 8-13 in rural communities, about human rights, gender violence, the importance of education, personal safety, financial management, emotional intelligence, new masculinity, mindfulness, etc. in order to improve their wellbeing, protect them from sexual abuse, give them a safe place to talk about difficult life situations, make sure they do not become teen parents, use violence or drop out of school.

In each group at least 70% of boys are selected because their situation of poverty or vulnerability. The aim is to break the cycle of poverty and violence by supporting the boys in their personal development. The goal is that they believe in their own strengths, reject violence, prioritize education, free themselves from abuse.

COST

1 club (1 village) for 1 year = **2860 USD**

Includes the male mentor, craft and sport materials, office supplies, mentor travels,

home visits to boys not showing up, logistics to provide secure space to the boys, weekly phone calls to boys not showing up, supervision of the program and final reporting. See detailed budget bellow.
